Year 1 Fire Station Visit

On Thursday 2nd November, Year 1 had the opportunity to visit Whittlesey Fire Station. The children listened to a fire safety talk around bonfire night and were told about fire safety in their homes. They had the opportunity to climb in the fire engine and were able to see all the equipment stored on the engine. Children and adults enjoyed using the fire hoses and listening to the sirens and seeing the flashing lights. Each child got to try on a fire helmet and some children dressed up in fire safety equipment.









Year 2 Church Trip

At the start of November Year 2 walked to St Mary's Church in Whittlesey as part of our RE learning about Places in Christianity. When we arrived, we met Mrs Palmer, who is one of the church wardens. She spoke to us about the history of the church and about why it is a special place in our community, including all the different things the church is used for. We explored inside the church and got to see lots of features that we had learnt about in our RE lessons, including the pulpit and the altar. We then went outside and learnt about the outside of the church including the clocks, the stained glass windows and the weather vane. We all had a fantastic time! Thank you to all of the adults who supported us on our walk.







To celebrate Walk to School Month in October, Barratt Homes donated 90 hi-vis bag tags for our Year 6 pupils. The bag tags are for the children to use whilst walking to and from school, in order to ensure they are easily seen on the roads as the darker nights draw in!







Safeguarding

In school, we have systems for filtering and monitoring the content viewed on the internet. Filtering blocks unsuitable content and monitoring checks search terms so we know if someone is trying to access unsuitable material. This rarely happens, but if a child does search for anything worrying we give them support and advice and of course we let you as parents know so you can support them too.

There are ways you can filter and monitor at home and the NSPCC has this helpful section on its site: NSPCC Parental Controls

This guide about YouTube contains some information, amongst other things, about monitoring and filtering on the platform.

If you have any worries about your child and the Internet, speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance. They may be able to help or they can put you in touch with our E-Safety lead, Mr Winfield who can advise.



Teaching and Learning Update

We have had 3 training days in this Autumn term and I thought I would let you know what we got up to in them.

Two of our days were spent with the rest of Soke Education Trust having expert input about assessing pupils' knowledge and understanding in foundation subjects. It was good to have this time and expertise: staff meetings since have been used to make small but significant changes to assessment so children can more easily communicate their learning to us.

The third day was spent at AJS launching a project where we work with academics from Anglia Ruskin University. This exciting project has teachers in small groups, choosing an element of learning to develop in school as a team, for instance, one group is looking at ways to increase pupil independence when working as historians. The academics will join us at future meetings to share relevant research and then teachers will use this research to improve practice in their chosen area. The project will last the whole school year.

We are really proud of the teaching and learning that takes place at AJS (OFSTED recognised this too) however we are still always looking for ways to develop and improve what we do to provide the best for all of our children.

Each Key Stage 2 class had a group session where they got to play a range of Samba instruments and compose and create large compositions as a class. The children had opportunities to try all of the instruments and perform together for an extended amount of time. Early Years and Key Stage 1 went to a Body Percussion workshops where they learned a range of rhythmic patterns using different parts of their bodies.
