Year 6 Whittlesey Schools Question of Sports Quiz

Year 4 Level 1 Bikeability Training

On Friday 10th October, 33 children from Year 4 took part in the Level 1 Bikeability Training. The training helped the children to control their bike in an off-road environment and develop balance and agility before they move on to developing on-road skills at Level 2 in Year 5/6.

During Level 1 Bikeability training, the children worked towards the following outcomes:

- Fit your own helmet.
- Carry out a simple bike check.
- Get on your bike, start cycling, then stop and get off.
- Ride your bike using the gears.
- Make your bike go where you want it to, including moving around objects safely.
- Control the bike with one hand.
- Stop quickly if you need to.
- Look all around you when you're riding, including behind, without wobbling.

All the children worked really hard and the Bikeability instructors said that they were a credit to AJS. Well done to those that took part.

Year 5/6 Level 2 - Bikeability Training

During the week beginning 13th October forty-eight Year 5/6 children took part in the level 2 bikeability training. This training is broken down into 2 levels. Level 1 involves the children demonstrating the skills and understanding to be able to make a trip and undertake activities in motor and traffic free environments. Level 2 involves the children demonstrating the skills and understanding to be able to make a trip safely to school or for leisure purposes. Well done to all the children who were awarded their bikeability certificates
