During Spring term two the Year 1 children have been working with a sports coach from Just Do Sport. They have been learning a variety of multi-skills including balancing, jumping and hand eye co-ordination. Just Do Sport are now also running the clubs on a Monday and Wednesday after school.

The children in Years 5 and 6 have had the opportunity to work with a Sport Coach. Year 5 and 6 have been working on different invasion games and orienteering, looking at skill development, teamwork and games play. The coaching has been funded by the Primary PE and Sports Premium money allocated to Primary Schools.

The children in Years 3 and 4 have worked with a rebound instructor. This has provided significant physical, mental, and developmental benefits for the children by improving balance, coordination, core strength, and cardiovascular health through low-impact movement.
