



Top Revision Tips!

- Create a schedule and stick to it.
- Ask for help when needed - don't try and test out your own methods in case it confuses your child, as there is a set formal method in the SATs tests.
 - Homework club on a Wednesday.
- Make notes when reading the revision guide with your child to help the learning sink in.
 - Listen to your child read, prompting them to pause at punctuation to develop fluency and use expression in their voice.
- Read to your child on occasion so they are also given time to enjoy the book if reading is a struggle for them.
 - Ask your child questions about what they have read.
- Keep revision a relaxing experience - don't become stressed out if it's difficult, or let it cause upset at home - ask us teachers to step in and help!
- Place as much importance on hobbies, playing outside with friends and having fun as you do revision!
- Practise the spelling rules regularly - not just the words we give out each week to be tested, but also other words that fit the rule.
- Complete timed mixed times table tests to develop speed and accuracy.
- Practise calculations which use the four operations regularly.
- Create posters of key facts and grammar terminology with your child and display them in the house.
 - Display key multiplication facts in your child's room or around the house.
