

'Teaching and Learning update'

On our October training day, teachers spent some time planning how we develop metacognition or 'thinking about thinking' in school and how we can encourage children to think about the strategies they use that help them learn. Here's a link to research-based guidance on this, in case you are interested: https://educationendowmentfoundation.org.uk/education-evidence/guidance-reports/metacognition

Children are already using various strategies, for instance to remember spellings, work out problems in maths and plan investigations in science. We are going to encourage children to use useful questions more often in planning, monitoring and evaluating their learning to help them develop metacognitive strategies even more. These are the types of questions we are encouraging children to consider at an age-and-stage-appropriate level for children (this example is from KS2 maths):

Safeguarding

The safeguarding snippet this time is about online safety and steps you can take to help keep your child safer online. We teach about online safety in school but children need support with this at home too and it can feel difficult to know how to help.

A good approach is to have an ongoing conversation about apps, games and sites your children like to use, and what they like and don't like. Ask them every so often if they have any concerns about being online.

Remind your child they can always speak to you or an adult in school if anything happens online that makes them feel worried or upset. Remind them that they won't be in trouble and that we are all here to help.
